


Engaged families in early literacy activities and educated parents on the importance of family literacy.

## Championing Digital Literacy

In 2023, MPL continued to develop Markham's digital skills and digital literacy through programs and camps that focus on STEAM, coding and robotics. A total **1,174 people** participated in these programs.











## Championing Digital Literacy

In 2023, MPL had **847** Makerspace bookings and **1,770 hours** of Makerspace time used.


**1,082 people** participated in programs focusing on Makerspace technology with **91%** of participants reporting they learned a new skill.

# New Collections and Resources

MPL has a diverse collection of physical and digital materials and resources and we continue to build on this.

In 2023, we launched a number of new physical collections and digital resources. Notably the renewed Black Heritage Collection, Trail Collection, Toy Library, and Brainfuse JobNow.















**Black Heritage Collection** 

Launched a renewed Black Heritage collection to enrich and strengthen the community through awareness of the heritage and literature of black Canadians, resulting in borrowing of **1,897** Black Heritage items.



We continued to expand and promote the library trail hub project.

**357** trail equipment items were borrowed, and **71** participated in trail programs.

# New Collections and Resources




Cornell Library added a **new Toy Library** with a strong focus on sensory toys to support children of different needs and abilities.
